



50th Anniversary Life Methodology



The questionnaire was designed by <u>Public</u> <u>Square Research</u> in partnership with Life Canada.



The research involved an online survey of 1500 English and French speaking adult Canadians.




The survey was fielded on April 26, 2019, using the Maru Voice panel.

Respondents for this survey were selected from among those who have registered to participate in the Maru Voice panel. The data have been weighted to reflect the demographic composition of Canada, according to statistics Canada. Because the sample is based on those who initially self-selected for participation in the Maru Voice panel rather than a probability sample, no estimates of sampling error can be calculated. However comparable samples of this size have a margin of error of +/- 3%.



Agree/Disagree Statements

Nine in ten agree that women who want to continue their pregnancies, but are under pressure to have an abortion should have more support, and eight in ten agree that doctors should be required to verify, in person, that there is no third party pressure.








Agree/Disagree by Gender

There are no substantive differences of opinion by gender, but women are somewhat less likely to say that there is already adequate support for women.








Circumstances: Abortion is Acceptable


Less than two in ten Canadians say that any reason is acceptable.

Few differences between men and women on what is acceptable.








Is there Law Restricting Abortion?

Three in ten say that there is a law, and men are more likely than women to say that there is a law.

As far as you know, is there any law restricting abortion in Canada?

Men	34%





50th Anniversary Life Summary

- Nine in ten say that women who want to continue their pregnancies, but are under pressure to have an abortion, should be given more support to help them through their pregnancies.
- Eight in ten agree that doctors should be required to verify, in person, that there is no third party pressure.
- Less than two in ten (16%) Canadians say that any reason is acceptable to have an abortion.
